Until the change, the site contains:

- **Home Page** contains an information gallery, buttons that take one to information on the many opportunities within DKG, member spotlight, an online chat feature, and more. To get to specific information, one must sign in to the site (button on the top right). The sign in requires one's membership number and password; contact Pat Harrison if you need your membership number.
- **Events** has a drop-down menu for conventions, conferences, calendar, related events, Go Ahead tours, and the *centennial celebration* (in 2029, DKG will celebrate its 100th anniversary. Each year leading up to the centennial celebration

will feature a video highlighting events of each decade of DKG).

- **Publications** links one to the Journal and the Collegial Bulletin.
- **Programs/Projects** drops down to Schools for Africa, Supporting Early Career Educators, Project Spotlight, Program Ideas for Chapters.
- **About Us**, through a drop-down menu, will take one to the Society's mission, vision, and purposes; benefits; discounts; insurance benefits; history; founders; administrative board; executive board; and, others.
- **Contact Us** has inquiry buttons (general, membership, DKGIEF, finance, publications, other) that when clicked on bring up a form one completes and sends on to International.
- **DKGIEF's** drop down lists various awards, funds, scholarships, World Fellowship, and a blog.

Scholarships, Grants and Recognition Opportunities

The Pennsylvania State Organization Nancy Grove Visionary Fund awards a grant to in-service active teacher members to fund innovative ideas and activities related to Excellence in Education within the educational community. This annual award is administered by the Past State Presidents of the Pennsylvania State Organization and will be awarded at the annual state convention. The grant is to be used during the school year immediately following the state convention. The application and rubric are on the state website. I can help you with the process if you need some support on the application process. Deadline is February 1, 2023.

The Album of Distinction (AOD) award represents a members' life work outside DKG and represents our Purpose #6... To stimulate the personal and professional growth of members, and to encourage their participation in appropriate programs of action. The honor must have been earned during the 2022 year. Nomination forms and rubric are on the state website and are to be submitted by March 1, 2023.

Scholarships to further your education can be applied for if you are an active member who is in good standing for a minimum of three years with Delta Kappa Gamma International Society and the Pennsylvania State Organization and meet the selection criteria requirements. The member must be enrolled in graduate study leading to an advanced degree, certification, endorsement, or job advancement. Credit may be earned during a regular and/or summer session at an accredited college or university. Deadline to apply is February 1, 2023. Applications are to be forwarded to Susan Martin; Scholarship Chair. Rubric and application can be found on the state website.

Enrichment Grant: If you would like to apply for an enrichment grant to help fund a project that would help with a project in your classroom, community, further your personal/professional growth this would be a great opportunity to look into. Enrichment grant

applications are due by February 1, 2023 to Susan Martin; Scholarship Chair. Rubric and application can be found on the state website.

The State Achievement Award is to recognize and honor a member who has given distinguished and outstanding service to the Pennsylvania State Organization (PA State Org.) and has promoted the purposes and the policies of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. If you have a member of Alpha Beta in mind who meets the requirements listed on the state website please see a member of the executive board to nominate this person. The nomination process for the member is to be kept a secret. If the member is selected they are named at the state convention in June. This award is awarded every other year and Alpha Beta is only allowed to nominate one member each of the award years. See me if you have questions. Rubric and application are on the state website. Applications are due by February 1, 2023.

If you apply for any of these opportunities our best advice is to follow the rubric specifics and complete the applications as requested. Your dedication to detail will help your application get reviewed and considered. If you have any questions about the grants, scholarships and/or awards please see Becky or me and we would be happy to help you in any way. Fingers crossed Alpha Beta will have applications and successful applicants at state convention.
