TRAVEL

It's no fun anymore!

On Saturday, September 16, I presented a program dealing with travelling. Changing regulations concerning airline and automobile modes of travel were discussed. Emphasis was placed on advance checking of specific airline suitcase size as regulations between carriers vary. Standard size is listed as height (22 inches), width (14 inches), and depth (9 inches).

Measure your suitcase as I demonstrated, including the handle and wheels before packing for your trip. This procedure avoids conflict at the gate!

Never lock your checked luggage to avoid damage during security inspections. TSA is not responsible for damages, if they have to break your locks.

Carry on luggage allows a total quart of liquids using the 3-1-1 formula. Each liquid item must be no more than 3.4 ounces. If security takes your item, you will not get it back. Watch packing articles which form a mass, as they will alert the X-ray system. You will be searched by security to identify the article.

Consider a TSA Pre-check to avoid security lines which costs \$85.00 for a 5 year clearance. A person can apply online, but one must also have an in person background appointment at an enrollment center. Pittsburgh Airport is a local site.

Be prepared for the REAL ID Act which was passed in 2005. A passport or special enhanced driver's license (not yet available) will be required to fly domestically. Pennsylvania must be in compliance by October 1, 2020, if the state is given an extension, otherwise January 22, 2018 will be when the REAL ID goes into effect.

Renew your passport now to avoid the rush and complications travelling. Passports are still mandated for overseas travel including Canada and Mexico.

A trip can still be fun, but lots of additional early planning needs to be completed.
