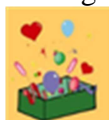

## **Minutes-Executive Board Meeting**

January 12, 2015

Present: Melody Hannegan, Paulette Hemmings, Marg Foster, Faith Jack, Peg Maser, Barb MacDonald, Terry Klein.

Peg Maser was asked to take minutes of the meeting. Melody had an agenda set up.

President's Report: The good news is that we have had consistent attendance. The Bad news is that we are still losing members. (51 currently). It was pointed out that we are still one of the largest chapters. We need to develop an action plan to be included with state-required reports.

Membership: We got one former member to return with our effort to re-invite past members (50 letters sent) to join again. We have lost members from Pine-Richland, Seneca Valley, and Hampton. New member orientation will be in April. We should continue to think about recruiting members into the coming years. There was a discussion concerning finding in-the-classroom teachers—perhaps looking at LaRoche College or CCAC.

Program: Melody has not received more information from Theta Chapter yet on the bi-chapter meeting on March 7 at McCormick and Schmick's on the South Side. Melody will do an abridged newsletter for February, with Feb. 7 and 11<sup>th</sup> deadlines so we can register for the Bi-Chapter meeting. For the Feb. 4 meeting, we will make a donation to CORE. There will be a meeting in May to plan for the 2015-2016 year. We have been proactive about carpooling for the Sept., October, and March meetings. We have had great feedback on the programs we have had.

Finances: We are holding the line. Local dues increase was a discussion topic, but it was not a favorable response from those present. We have a CD to cash before we raise dues. We lost 11 members and added 1 reserve.

Fundraising/Projects: Jared Boxes—Make 30 that are better quality. Melody has some (donated by Dede Rittman) and Peg will buy the rest. Tags will be made for the different categories, and members will pick them up at the Feb. meeting and can return them by the May meeting. For the Chair Project, it was decided to ask members to buy or sell \$30.00 worth of raffle tickets. Tickets are \$2 each or 3 for \$5. The PA Head Start program is the recipient of the funds.

Album of Distinction: Darlene Farrell and Dede Rittman will be nominated by the chapter.

Discussion of going digital was tabled for later.

New Business: For the May meeting, we will be at the School House in Cranberry from 6-7 and have dessert at the library from 7-8—need to bring coffee pots and paper products and set up the room. Members will be asked to bring dessert and utensils to serve it. We will check out the fee to use these facilities.

The business meeting began at 6:55 p.m. President Melody Hannegan welcomed everyone to the meeting. Terry Klein noted that our speakers had been a great source of inspiration, so not much more needed to be said. Melody then spoke about our loss of Areta Kalogeras. Darlene Farrell and Diane Goff also spoke of their personal memories of Areta. We had a moment of silence in her memory.

The minutes from the December meeting were approved as printed in the January newsletter, with no additions or corrections. The Executive Board met in January, and the minutes from that meeting will be printed in a future newsletter. Barb Schmid read the Treasurer's Report in Marg Foster's absence. The balance on hand is \$2546.20. Peg Maser reported that she had sent a thank you note to Caitlin Driscoll, our December speaker, and a sympathy card to Areta's family.

Melody led the discussion of the candidates for membership. Five names were submitted for consideration: Shari McGill and Jill Millard of Shaler Area School District and Fran Bogos, Pam Ross, and Nancy Weixel of North Allegheny School District. Terry Klein moved that we accept all five candidates, and Karen Klingman seconded the motion. In a voice vote, we agreed to ask the five women to join our chapter in May.

Paulette Hemmings read information about the Bi-Chapter Meeting on March 7 at McCormick and Schmick's on the South Side. The invitation/response form will be included in this newsletter. Ride-sharing will be offered.

Under Projects, Phyllis Jenny handled the Silent Auction throughout the evening. After some lively bidding, many lovely items now have new homes, and \$169.00 was raised for Schools for Africa. Peg Maser then discussed the Jared Boxes which were available in the back of the room. She read a letter from the State Jared Box organization thanking us for last year's donation to Children's Hospital. It was noted that the hardest categories to fill are 11 and above and 2 and under. Karen Klingman and Jessie Friedrich had purchased several bags of items already, and that was distributed among the boxes to start. Labels and suggestions for items were included. And members were asked to sign a list indicating which box/boxes they had taken. They need to be returned by the May meeting, or call Peg Maser or Karen Ulrich for pick-up. For the Pete the Cat Chair Project, the Executive Board decided to make it a raffle since logistics and responsibilities for taking it to various libraries were complex. Tickets for members to print out will be included in this newsletter. Each member's goal is \$30 worth (Tickets are 1 for \$2 and 3 for \$5.) Money/tickets are due at the May meeting, when the raffle will be held.

Items for the tool box for the Handywoman basket for the State convention in June were listed and members were to sign up for items to contribute. These, too, are due at the May meeting.

Karen Klingman won the raffle basket. We sang the Delta Kappa Song to end the meeting at 7:40.
