This award will be biennial.

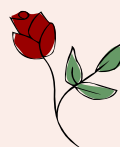
It will be given at the last meeting of the second year of the president's term of office.

8 ACTIVITY: Girl Scouts recite the Girl Scout Mission.

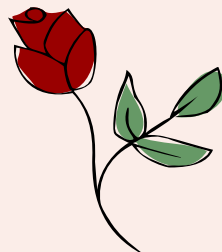

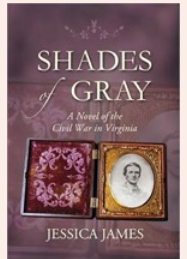
