## FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

As we begin the new calendar year of 2024, we must look ahead to our next fiscal year which begins July 1, 2024. Members of the Executive Board approved the payment amounts at the December meeting and these will be presented to the membership for a vote at the February meeting. This timeline will allow members to remit dues in a timely manner during the payment period which opens April 1, 2024, and closes May 31, 2024. The total for Active Members is \$80, for Reserve Members is \$35, and for Collegiate Members is \$30. The dues breakdown is as follows:

- I. Purpose

- II. Criteria for Selection
  - The applicant must be an active member in Chi Chapter in the Pennsylvania State Organization of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International.
  - The applicant must be an active working professional in her respected field.
  - The applicant is encouraged to resubmit this application during another year if it is not selected by the Past Chi Chapter Presidents.
  - The award is presented on an annual basis at the April meeting for Chi Chapter.
  - No Chi Member may receive the award a second time within a biennium; an exception will be considered if there are no other applicants.

III. IMPORTANT NOTE TO APPLICANT: Make sure your application is complete, typed using correct grammar and spelling, and signed. You may want to have a friend read your application to make sure it states what you wish to present.

IV. The \$300 grant will be awarded at the Spring meeting of the year submitted and must be used by June 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year.

## SISTER SPOTLIGHT

This sister grew up in Lancaster on a plant farm. She was the middle of five siblings. Her father was a wholesale florist. They had a big house, barn, greenhouses with fields of carnations, mums and pompoms. There was always work to be done before and after school. However, her parents wanted us to do the best we could at school. She loved playing school as a child.

She was the first generation in her family to get a college degree earning a BS from Millersville University in 1979 followed by a Master's Degree with Reading Specialist Certification in 1995, Penn State University Principal Certification 2003 and finally a Doctor of Education from Widener University in 2011.

She began teaching in 1979 for Chester County Intermediate Unit with her first placement in Benner Elementary School, Coatesville, PA. She taught 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> grade students labeled with a learning disability in a self-contained classroom. Most of the students came from the Child Development Center in Coatesville. This was the time students with disabilities were being placed back into regular schools. That first year she had five different supervisors. It was during those first years of teaching she discovered how little she knew about teaching reading which inspired her to get her reading certification later in life.

Our sister loves to spend time at her family cabin in the mountains. She also likes traveling and having adventures with my family and friends. She is enjoying retirement and now that she has time, she enjoys reading, walking, piano, puzzles, shopping and playing games.


She has been married to her loving husband Mark for 45 years. They have a daughter Jen married to Matt with two children Mark (9) and Jaxon (6). Jen is an orchestra/music teacher at Pennridge High School in Bucks County. They

Around 1979, I had a bumper sticker on my car "Have You Hugged Your Child Today." Too often we forget to give our children a hug or a kiss good night. Think about your childhood memories. You remember the good and also the bad. I will never forget when my 83 year old uncle told me about how his 3<sup>rd</sup> grade teacher ridiculed him at school in front of his peers. After all those years, this still bothered him. I challenge myself and all of us to speak kindly, love lavishly, forgive generously, and hug your child today.
