### During the October Ways and Means meeting, four recruitment grant recipients were honored

As of the last school year, almost 10,000 PA teachers left education according to a Penn State survey. More alarming is the critically low number of newly certified teachers to replace the chasm in the classrooms. As we have for the last 75 years, the Psi chapter offers scholarships to college women pursuing degrees in teaching. To help facilitate improvement of this emergency, the members in the recent past have increased their number of available scholarships and the amount awarded. As educators, Psi members care deeply about this crisis.

On Saturday October 21, 2023, four women were recognized and awarded with the annual grants. All of these outstanding women share a common bond in being Dean's List students while also being employed. Further, three of the women have a double major which requires additional coursework.

Member Linda London introduced the young women at the meeting. Psi chapter president, Yvonne Ransbottom expressed the group's response to these four awardees, "You are the promise of the future of our profession. You embody the character and drive we admire."
