

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE COMMITTEE

I. Role

The Educational Excellence Committee is composed of a Facilitator who is the First Vice President of the State Organization, 4 Co-chairman, and additional committee members. They share the responsibilities of Professional Affairs, Personal Growth & Services, Projects, Visual & Performing Arts, and US Forum.

Their responsibilities include:

- promoting Schools for Africa,
- planning the Friday Night Fun and Fellowship at State Convention,
- promoting support for Early Career Educators,
- planning and promoting the Album of Distinction program,
- selecting of workshops and presenters for State Convention,
- recognizing any Doctorate Degrees,
- recognizing members with 40 years or more of membership,
- organizing the Spiritual Unity Service on Sunday morning of Convention,
- planning for all music needed for the Convention,
- assisting with the plans for the Purposeful Seminar,
- and planning and assisting the First Vice President with the Celebration Luncheon.
- Keep members informed of legislative issues regarding education, women and children.

II. Biennial Goals

- Continue to assist chapters in their committee restructuring, if that is their desire;
- Inform chapters of the work of EEC and the impact on their chapter membership;
- Communicate regularly with chapter counterparts via email, snail mail, newsletters, and visits;
