- January 3, 2018: Up to \$10,000 may be awarded to groups or individuals for projects that not only benefit children and education but also encourage intercultural understanding and educational excellence.

· February 1, 2018: Members and nonmembers can apply for Cornet Individual Professional Development (CIPD) Awards to participate in events and activities that occur between March 15, 2018 and October 15, 2018.

## Doing Good For Goode

Crystal asked me to write a small article for this newsletter regarding my volunteer work at Goode Elementary School.

I am the Social Action chairperson for "Doing Good for Goode". The project was started by Temple Beth Israel approximately 4 years ago. Temple Beth adopted Goode school as its outreach program in the community. The project was named for Rabbi Alexander B. Goode. He is one of the Four Chaplains who lost his life when the WWII ship Dorchester sank. Rabbi and three other chaplains gave up their life vests so others would survive.

Approximately 700 students attend Goode School. Goode serves students from Pre-K to 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Projects that we sponsor at Goode

include: a back to school supply drive, organize and purchase items in the nurses' closet and work in the courtyard garden. This year, our Back to School supply drive provided spiral notebooks, pens, pencils, and crayons for over 700 students. With some funds from TBI, I supply uniforms, personal hygiene items and purchase underwear. You remember from teaching how frequently little students have accidents and need clean underwear.

How can you help? At December's meeting, I am asking for gifts of underwear and/or sweatpants. For the underwear, we need sizes 6-8, 8-10, 10-12 for both girls and boys. I could also use small size women's underwear. Sweatpants are needed for girls and boys- small, medium and large-sizes 6-12. Walmart carries all these items and I find that they have the best prices.
