

#### **State President's Message**

"I was lucky. I began teaching the same year Annie Webb Blanton in Texas founded DKG to promote the professional interests and position of women in education. When I began teaching, a woman teacher who married could lose her job. My friend Isabel was called before the school board because they suspected she had secretly married. At the board meeting, she protested and said, 'I don't know how to prove to you I'm, not

married. A married woman could prove she was married by producing a wedding certificate. But there's no certificate to prove I'm not married.'

My friend Dolly, another teacher was Catholic. The school district would not employ Catholic teachers so Dolly joined another church.

Later when I taught high school, men teachers who coached were paid. We, women, who advised the yearbook, directed plays etc. after school were not paid. At the same school, the salary committee could always formulate salary policies that benefited husbands and fathers rather than us single women. I feel lucky that Annie Webb Blanton founded DKG to support desirable legislation in the interest of women teachers. Thank you, Annie Webb Blanton."

The following written excerpts came from a member who passed away in 2004 at the age of 95. Marjorie May of Alpha Alpha Chapter wrote the essay on the occasion of her chapter's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary and Founders Day. Marjorie, a retired teacher with an extensive resume, understood...she got it! embraced the vision and realized the 'power of the dream' of Dr. Annie Webb Blanton, a small Texas woman whose vision was enormous yet simple—to enhance the opportunities for women and unite them to accomplish worthy endeavors.

Our vision, as has our Society, grew over the years, 'leading women educators impacting education world wide.' The simple vision has become a global initiative encompassing a worldwide community. During this past year my hope and challenge to each member has been to find the vision within, the vision that lives in your heart, and can drive you and your chapter forward as members of a flour-

ishing and growing Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. There is power in the dreams and imagination of each individual member that has brought us to our 75<sup>th</sup> year. And, our individual strengths to create change and our collective commitments to the mission of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International will continue to move us forward.

What needs to be done now to turn each chapter's vision and our State's vision into action? Our next step? Come to State Convention. Begin your steps into finding the answers and ideas to realize your personal vision as a member and your chapter's future vision. Change happens whether we want it or not. A familiar quote is a reminder of the individualities and personalities of humankind. "When it comes to the future, there are three kinds of people: those who let it happen, those who make it happen, and those who wonder what happened." Key

Thapter membership chairmen have a greater challenge than finding ways to interest new members. It is in retaining members that meets the challenge. How do we create a bond where

new members feel nurtured and empowered with a sense of professionalism and fellowship?

In the winter Keystonian Gisele Siebold suggested that DKG members have the power of TNT. WOW! That is a dynamite challenge for us to think about. We joined .... an international society that promotes professional and personal growth in women educators and excellence in education. That is POWER! However, this power comes with a price: time, dedication, enthusiasm, mentoring and pride!

No one comes to a meeting to sit and listen to what could happen.... what they could do if.... or might do. When time is a precious commodity these days, women join a group that is moving toward its purposes and goals with strength and enthusiasm. Pride sustains members! Focus on the pride in the bigger picture of our society. Women teachers will look for activities that enrich and stimulate, as well as activities that create genuine fellowship with their peers.

How can you ignite your members and give the chapter the power that will be recognized in the schools and community? What challenges have you given members? Have you asked early-career educators to present a program about their experiences and new teaching techniques? Has the scholarship committee met with members who are looking for grants and scholarships? Have you planned a project meeting where everyone can help or organize your own mini-creative arts retreat? Invite members of neighboring chapters to visit or share a project event. Begin your meetings with a surprise guest or activity that creates movement and conversation. Don't ever follow the same boring pattern of busi-Recognize and reward members for their ness. accomplishments great and small. Get out and take a bus trip. Do you have a plan to Support Early-Career Educators (SECE)? Have you volunteered or promoted a school program in some way?

The igniters in your chapter are the ones who think out of the box, who go the extra mile, who everyone looks to with pride and accomplishment. Your nominating committee needs to look for those members who can be the TNT for your chapter as you look ahead to another biennium. The challenge of supporting new members lies with the entire membership and extends beyond mentoring. Working together, DKG members can be dynamite in your chapter, schools and community.

women educators fit into the second category—they make things happen.

I listed excerpts from the writing of our deceased sister, Marjorie May, a Key Woman Educator. Marjorie realized early through models such as Dr. Annie Webb Blanton, that women had to make things happen for themselves and she, herself, is a model to us for the dreams that propelled her visions forward back then. Her resume is extensive but a few dreams realized need to be noted, as they should inspire each of us to commit to our dreams. Mariorie started the Lehigh-Northampton Association of Teachers of English. She authored historical booklets about her area and about her church. She served in the Peace Corps and raised

funds to build Peace Corps Partnership Schools in Africa, which now total more than 150 schools in her name. Marjorie received numerous awards, including the Sargent Shriver Award in Washington DC for her service to the Peace Corps and was a guest in the White House Rose Garden with former president George Bush. These are just a few of her accolades but certainly show that when members believe in themselves as Key Women Educators, use the purposes to shape performance to our mission, and display the excitement that sparks imagination and passion, we have the ingredients to continue the vision of our founders and

take the steps into designing a future.

Our International guest, Carolyn




Pittman, is from the state of Arkansas where she has been state organization president; state organization editor; international convention steering committee co-chair; regional conference steering



#### SOME HINTS FOR FIRST TIME STATE CONVENTION ATTENDEES:

- ~ Guidelines for dress are easy and comfortable Friday, casual; Saturday, school clothes or dressy casual; Saturday evening, your best dressy; Sunday, traveling clothes.
- ~ Register and unpack at the Nittany Lion Inn where you'll get a car tag to put on your vehicle and then park free at the adjacent garage.
- ~ Make sure to buy chances for all the raffle baskets—baskets donated by chapters are outstanding and the proceeds from the raffle help defray convention costs. <u>There are appropriate times to put your tickets in the basket when meetings are not going on.</u>
  <u>Make sure you see the schedule within the convention booklet.</u>
- ~ Plan to go to the First Timers session Friday evening as we give you a Birdseye view of what to expect at Convention and the role you play in the State Organization. This is also a good time to meet and greet other first timers.
- ~ Do you like to sing? Everyone is welcomed to join the chorus. See the schedule for chorus rehearsals.
- ~ Be sure to sign up for all planned convention meals, Saturday's Luncheon, Saturday's Banquet, and Sunday's Brunch. (Note: Saturday morning's continental breakfast is for your convenience only; the dining room offers a full breakfast menu for about the same price or less if you woud rather dine there.)
- ~ The Friday night meal is not planned but Whiskers (pub within the hotel) has a menu and the dining room has a full menu and seafood buffet. (Dining room opens at 5:30 and takes reservations, too)
  - ~ Don't miss the Friday night fling! It

will prove to be a fun way to kick off convention, draw attention to the state project, and develop new friendships.

## ~ Chapter Presidents make up the Executive Board of Alpha Alpha State.

All members, though, may attend the executive board meeting on Friday and all members should attend the first general session on Saturday and the second general session on Sunday. All members can speak and do have a vote.

- ~ Plan on attending workshops in the morning and afternoon. During even number years, morning workshops present workshops on Society business. Afternoon workshops provide opportunities to pickup Act 48 credit. Based on last year's evaluations the Educational Excellence Committee has planned afternoon workshops for you that address some of the comments and wishes you voiced. Most of the afternoon workshops offer Act 48 credit.
- ~ Please note that it is not the job of the state photographer to take chapter pictures. She has her own schedule she needs to follow. If you would like your own pictures please bring your own cameras, etc.
- ~ Though Sunday morning comes early, plan on getting up to attend the Spiritual Unity service and then the Celebration of Life Ceremony. Both will be inspiring as we join together around the theme and remember those who had the vision to build the Society for each of us.
- ~ Lastly, evaluations are important as we try to meet the needs of members. Before you leave on Sunday please turn in your evaluations.

#### U.S. Forum

The role of the U. S. Forum is to disseminate information in a non-partisan position. This service will enable members to easily obtain information pending federal legislation in order to contact legislators and thereby becoming advocates for women, children and education.

#### <u>In Pennsylvanía...</u>

#### **Tougher Budgets Cuts Face School Districts this Spring**

Many of us are hearing from our school superintendents that district budgets are facing major deficits due to all of the reasons that we are well aware of. This will necessitate further cuts in programming and staff in order to make it work. It is so important that we attend, listen, ask questions and share ideas that perhaps they have not thought of. It is also important to stay abreast of the latest news from AFT and PSEA.

It is also important to carefully monitor what school board members are thinking and doing. Good board members who are willing to "think out of the box" and to entertain ideas from their constituents are what the children in their schools need and have a right to!

#### "Partners in Education"

Parents, community leaders, and elected officials now have an opportunity to work with educators as partners through a new program called, "Partners in Education." The mission is to provide information about the public education policy in PA and to create connections with public schools in communities where "partners" live. For more information, go to www.partnersforpubliceducation.org.

### **Update on Teacher Information Management System (TIMS)**

The TIMS website is now open for applicants and certifying entities. The PA Department of Education has changed from the known Teacher Certification System (TCM) to the new TIMS. All new certifications, add-ons, Level II and emergency permit applications need to be made through this system. In addition, all certified individuals should also sign in to the TIMS website. This data processing website will provide educators with access to print out certificates

and check on Act 48 credits. Check out the website at www.PA-TIMS.com for more details.

#### **Changes to the Instructional Certificates**

Beginning January 1, 2013, the PA Department of Education will begin issuing Instructional Certificates in several new areas. They are Early Childhood-PreK-4; Elementary/Middle-Grades 4-8 with a focus area; Special Education-PreK-8 with dual certification in Early Childhood, E/M or Reading Specialist; Special Education-Grades 7-12 with dual certification in Secondary content area(s) or Reading Specialist.

Instructional certificates before January 1, 2013 will remain valid. If an educator is considering adding an instructional area to their certificate, it would be prudent to do so prior to the January deadline because getting a qualified score on the Praxis test is the requirement, but after that date, certain certificate additions will need the educator to enroll in a post-baccalaureate program or an accelerated preparation program.

It is important to note that educators with additional instructional areas provide themselves and their districts more options for their teaching assignments. Contact the Bureau of School Leadership and Teacher Quality at PDE for more information.

#### Average Won't Cut It Anymore

Thomas Friedman's newest book once again has ramifications for educators, in fact for all of us! In his book, The World is Flat, he shared with us the importance of educating our students for a global society and that they need to be very aware of all the young people in China and India who are "hungry" for the way of life of Americans and they are working very hard to achieve it in their studies. Now he is stating that average in America is over. And that parents and educators need to instill in our youth that they need to take pride in their work

#### Fostering Relationships with Legislators

Legislators really do want to hear from their constituents! Here are several ways in which build relationships with them.

- ~Go into their office and introduce yourself to them. Don't wait for a crisis to do this.
- ~Be sure to give them your personal story on the issue you are concerned about.
- ~Always address them with their titles, i.e. Senator, even if you know them well.
- ~Be sure to site evidence and show data to support the issue. (see FORUMS page 15)

~Invite them into your classroom or school.

~"Skype" them into your elementary or civics classes.

~The best way to get their attention is face to face. The phone call ranks second and emails and letters are last. **STAY AWAY from form emails,** unless it has your story!



#### Ann E. Hildebrand August 15, 2011




