# **Are You Involved?**

calling us to involvement in activities supportive of women and education, our Society invites us to
step into the arena and raise our
voices. What are you doing to
raise your voice?

The January 29, 2018 issue of *Time* prefaced a six-page article about women in politics with the following two-page pronouncement, "One year ago, millions of women protested in the streets. Now there are more women running for office than ever before." The Rutgers University's Center for American Women and Politics reports that as of December 2017, 369 women were running or planning to run for Congress in 2018.

According to the organization, *She Should Run*, "Women are under-represented at all levels in the 500,000+ elected offices across the U.S." *She Should Run* is committed to getting at least

250,000 women to run for office by 2030. This nonpartisan organization recruits women candidates

Purpose # 3: To advance the professional interest and positions of women in education. Purpose # 4: To initiate, endorse, and support desirable legislation in the interest of education and of women educators. Purpose # 6: To stimulate the personal and professional growth of members and to encourage their participation in appropriate programs of action.

Purpose # 7: To inform the membership of current economic, social, political, and educational issues so they may participate effectively in a world society.

and assists those who want to support them.

Are you a potential political candidate? Is there a woman you can encourage to seek office?

Do you have funds or time or connections or resources to provide in support of a candidate? What discussions would be happening in Congress right now if, instead of the current 20 percent, 50 percent of the legislature were women?

Like Oprah, maybe running for political office isn't in your DNA. We don't need to be a member of Congress to a have a voice. The votes we cast, the daughters we raise, the young women we teach and mentor, the calls we make, the emails and letters we send, the caring we show, the time we give, the marches we do, and the money we donate are powerful acts of voice. We do not speak with one voice. We each have a story to tell whether that story is our own or that of someone we know who is suffering an injustice. Educators are masters at telling the story. Let your voice be heard. Speak up and tell the story you know.

provide love, comfort and support in many ways These friendships helped her heal, move forward, and create a new life. Food was an integral part of these relationships as friends brought meals to her home for weeks, invited her out for coffee, to their homes for meals or out to dinner. Whenever they got together, food was always present. Reflecting on their profound impact and the gifts they gave her: encouragement, knowledge, a dependable anchor to keep her steady and on course, wisdom, and fun. This led Christine to share the message of friendship. These gifts showed her where she needed to grow and develop. The idea to write *Comfort* Food - One Woman's Journey to Understand the Meaning and Significance of Friendship, sprang from the experience.

In addition to writing *Comfort Food*, Christine began sharing her journey by speaking with people in their homes, later moving to public venues,

including libraries, churches, women's groups, youth groups, retreats and professional organizations.


